*The Isles Gathering"- Inspired by the success of the Orkney Gathering project, which premiered at the 2011 Orkney Folk Festival, the Isles Gathering will unite several generations of Shetland and Orkney musicians to showcase the distinctively rich musical heritage of the Northern Isles. From teenage stars like Liza Fullerton to veteran moothie ace and storyteller Billy Jolly, twenty-four musicians (as well as invited guests) will be united under the musical directorship of Douglas Montgomery and Margaret Scollay to prepare showcase concerts for both the Shetland and Orkney Folk Festivals this year.

≈April Verch Band - Internationally renowned Canadian fiddler, singer, songwriter and stepdancer, April Verch is returning to Shetland with her infamous highenergy performances. Her music is old-time with a side of Canada's Ottawa Valley, mixing plucky, straight-backed Canadian tunes with ancient Appalachian ballads.

≈Skerryvore - First formed in 2005 on the tiny Isle of Tiree off Scotland's west coast, Skerryvore soon found themselves performing in over 20 countries worldwide, with four albums and an array of industry awards under their belt. They are "a living, breathing, 12-legged party waiting to happen."

~Old Man Luedecke - The recording name of Juno Award-winning Canadian singer-songwriter and banjo player, Chris Luedecke. Hailing from Nova Scotia, his claw hammer-banjo picking and pounding foot-keeping rhythm transports listeners back to the era of folk troubadours like Woody Guthrie and Pete Seeger.

Niamh Ní Charra Band - Hailing from Killarney, Ireland, Niamh is a multiple award winner on both fiddle and concertina, who has toured extensively with Riverdance as well as the likes of The Chieftains and Carlos Núñez. Awarded Female Musician of the Year in the Live Ireland Music Awards 2012, don't miss her first class band.

~Woody Pines - North Carolina singer-songwriter Woody Pines is a natural performer, storied and steeped in the best of American music. With his 4-piece band, their performances are full of stomp and swing with an intoxicating blend of rural and urban stringband, country blues, ragtime and jug band music.

➢ Cóig - ("Ko-ig". Gaelic for '5') is an exciting line-up of five solo acts from Nova Scotia, Canada including three profiled fiddlers. So much did they enjoy performing together when asked to form a promotional band of participants for a festival, they now try to play as the Cóig whenever they can.

~Cedric Watson - From the warm heart of Cajun Country, Cedric Watson is one of the brightest young talents to emerge in Cajun, Creole and Zydeco music over the last decade. Now based in Louisiana, this four-time Grammy-nominated fiddler, singer, accordionist and songwriter has seemingly unlimited potential.

➢Kieran Goss - Born and raised in County Down and long hailed as one of Ireland's leading songwriters and performers, Kieran Goss's music has won him fans across the globe. But if his songs have made him a star, his live shows have made him a legend. ≈Rob Heron and the Teapad Orchestra - are one of the hardest working bands on the UK roots music circuit. A hot six-piece featuring guitars, mandolin, harmonica, accordion, trumpet, double bass and percussion, they mix Western Swing, Gypsy Jazz, Hokum Blues, Ragtime, Čajun, and Roots-of-Country.

The Long Notes - Representing Ireland, England and Scotland, this four piece formed six years ago having met through the session scene of Camden Town, London. They perform captivating arrangements of Irish, Scottish, French-Canadian, Galician, Quebecois and old-time tunes as well as their own stunning compositions

Son Yambu - Performing red hot rhythms, straight from the streets of Santiago de Cuba, this 5 piece will play authentic Cuban Son, the essential Afro-Cuban sound that originated in the streets of eastern Cuba and gave rise to modern salsa.

~Leon Hunt n-Tet - Featuring undoubtedly one of the best 5 string banjo players in the UK, Leon Hunt and his band (featuring vocals, bass and mandolin) plays homage to their musical heroes by performing bluegrass favourites by the likes of Earl Scruggs and Doc Watson. You'll be left asking "are these really all Brits?"

& The Rambling Boys of Pleasure - The Rambling Boys of Pleasure are a collection of well-known Irish musicians who love to explore their music and look for new directions in which to take it. Featuring Bernard O'Neill, Gino Lupari, Alan Burke, David Munnelly and Sean Regan, this is a lineup not to be missed!

➢Fionia Stringband - This trio delivers rustic and lively Danish folk music including everything from good old polkas, lyrical tunes to heart-warming waltzes. A meeting of two generations of folk musicians, all from the Danish island of Funen, they share a passion for traditional melodies.

~Paddy Callaghan, Adam Brown and Danny Boyle-Fresh from winning the BBC Radio Scotland Young Traditional Musician of the Year, we are delighted to welcome back accordion player Paddy Callaghan accompanied by Danny Boyle on flute and Adam Brown on bodhrán, as this year's dedicated session band.


