Airplang: A scintillating and sometimes electric three piece band from New England, USA, featuring Rodney Miller on fiddle, Peter Barnes on piano and synthesiser and John McGann on guitar, mandolin and scintillator.

Byron Berline & John Hickman: Byron, one of America's foremost bluegrass fiddle players has played with them all including Bill Monroe, Henry Mancini and the Rolling Stones but not yet Tom Anderson, to name-drop only four. John Hickman plays a tight and twangy five-string banjo and is one of the few guests this year able to recognise Alphonse Piquot.

Isla St Clair: Needs no introduction to Shetland audiences. She was here as a youngster of 14 since when she's gone on to become a national celebrity. This is her first trip back to Shetland and both she and Shetland are delighted at the prospect.

Les Luthier's Crystal: The trade name for a super duo of instrument makers from Britanny who have taken the art to its extreme by producing a pure, clear sound. Featured along side Gerry O'Connor in our Fixing Fiddle Faults Workshop.

Seamus & Manus McGuire with Garry O'Briain: From the West Coast of Ireland the McGuire brothers lead on fiddle with an occasional viola. Garry plays a mean and sophisticated mandocello — according to Colin McAllister of Setanta, he's one of the best rhythm sections around.

Setanta: A seven strong band from Glasgow with Uillean pipes, fiddle, hammered dulcimer, concertina, flute, bodhran (for Maureen and Sheila) and bouzouki plus vocals.

Gerry O'Connor & Eithne Ni Uallachain: Husband and wife from Ireland's East Coast on fiddle and flute with Eithne providing Irish songs in a lovely clear voice. Gerry also makes fiddles and will feature in one of the workshops.



This year's local talent: Tom Anderson and The Young Heritage, Robbie Pearson, Colin & Alan, Hom Bru, Da Soond's O' Shetland, Charlie Simpson, Garster's Dream Band, Scrape the Barrel, Identity Crisis, The Shetland Fiddlers, Northmavine Fiddle & Accordion Club Jim Halcrow's Band, The Walls Dance Band, Rhoda Bulter, Eart Kyent, Debbie & Willie, Campbell & Julie Gray, Westside Fiddle & Accordion Club, The Junior Shetland Fiddlers, Maggie Robertson, Fred's Band, Davie & Jenny with Stuart, Alec Couper.

Kieran Goss: Singer songwriter from County Down — according to Tom Mulligan of Blackrock, one of the brightest stars to appear in his back parlour.

The Beggarmen: Five young men from the Newcastle area; talent spotted by one of our scouts in the Golden Fleece, Alnwick in 1985. Their wide repertoire includes Irish and Northumbrian tunes and nursery rhymes. Led by the gentle amnesiac Tony Corcoran with Billy along as minder.

Jenny & The Hermit: An eccentric novelty act from Greenwich Village in New York. Jenny is a quarter blood Cherokee (Indian name Thunderskins) who along with The Hermit will demonstrate a variety of percussion techniques and also provide the ethnic meal to accompany the Belly Dance Workshop.

Mrs Ackroyd: Accompanied by Les Barker — probably the most original and unusual poet now employed by Marchester City Council. Palfi the Laughologist: A clown who is creative, unpredictable, rascally, riotous, witty, gentle, warm and utterly charming.

Josephine El Djemal & The Mysteries of the East: This year's answer to over-eating. Josephine and her team will host a belly-dance workshop on Sunday as well as providing demos of eastern ethnic dance during the Festival.

Jim Rosie & Moyra Fraser: Here last year with Moyra's band Jim will be competing during the festival ably abetted and assisted by Moyra.

Gas Mark V: A new experience for Shetland dancers — an English dance band featuring melodeon, bass trombone, harmonica, drums and electric piano plus a caller, Mary Panton, to help you make it through the dance.

Sleipnir: From Faroe; Brandur Ossursson is bringing his line up of trumpet, saxophone, piano, bass guitar and drums to play happy jazz. This band is named after Odin's eight legged flying horse, so look out below.

Alphonse Piquot: A rapidly deteriorating whistle and wheeze pipes virtuoso in his late sixties and likely to be the discovery of this year's festival, his personality problems and slight command of the language are overcome by unparallelled grit, sand, and sheer determination. Not to mention gypsy chutzpah.

Kashmir: A brother and sister duo from Manchester who write and perform their own material.

Corcoran's Ceili Band: A hand picked bunch chosen, schooled and led by Tony Corcoran with ace caller, Peter "Dinky" Desmond.

Caveat: A seedy, tired and jaded group, comprising the whole of the Folk Festival Committee who will stand around both separately and together, unable to guarantee the authenticity of these decriptions but will guarantee that you should enjoy yourselves.
