Lorraine Jordan: Born in Wales of Irish parents, Lorraine has been singing in folk clubs since her teens. Accompanying herself on both guitar and bouzouki, and singing mostly her own material, Lorraine is certainly making her mark on the folk scene as an outstanding solo performer.

Walt Michael & Company: Walt Michael, a multi-instrumentalist, but probably best known as a hammered dulcimer player, plays traditional and contemporary music with a joy and vitality that is infectious. Walt's various musical incarnations have taken traditional string band music from the coal camps of Appalachia to the Closing Ceremonies of the 13th Olympic Games.

Arthur Middleton: Hailing from Aberdeen, Arthur has been playing harmonica for some 53 years. In that time he has picked up many an award, including the All Britain Diatonic Harmonica Championship in 1990. He has recently become a 'crack hand' on the Jewsharp.

Hamish Moore and Dick Lee Quartet: Renowned for exploring new combinations of instruments - Overton whistle and recorder, Scottish small pipes and clarinet, Highland pipes and saxophone. Hamish and Dick are joined by Rick Barnford and Graham Robb in an exciting jazz folk fusion.

Rayneld Ouellet, Jes Kroman and Morten Alfred: French Canadian music with a Danish feell Raynald is one of Canada's most accomplished one- and three-row accordion players. Accompanying Raynald are Morten, one of Denmark's finest guitar players and Jes, on fiddle, making a very welcome return to Shetland.

Spice Trade: A recently formed jazzbluesgrass band featuring Chris Haigh (ex Zumzeaux) on fiddle and mandolin, Dudley Phillips (sessionerwith Womack & Womack and John Etherldge) on double bass, Rick Bolton and Companions of the Rosy Hour's Frank Kilkelly on guitar. Tara: A well travelled group of five musicians/singers from Ireland, Scotland and Norway who are based in Oslo. With bodhran, cellomandolin, tinwhistle and fiddle, Tara specialise in Traditional Irish Music.

Taffy Thomas and Steafan Hannigan: Despite his name, Taffy Thomas, originates from the South West of England. Describing himself as a Jobbing Storyteller, his repertoire of stories, tales and elaborate lies are guaranteed to entertain. Joining Taffy is the Belfast born musician Steafan Hannigan who is a fine exponent of the Uilleann pipes, having recently won the title of All Britain champion.

John Teasdale: A professional juggler for seven years who presents a variety of routines with an emphasis on comic patter, a stream of visual gags and occasional help from audience volunteers.

Vasmalom: The most exciting and original group yet to have emerged from the new wave of Hungarian folk music. Vasmalom adapt traditionall-lungarian music to their collection of unusual instruments, which includes utogarton, hurdy-gurdy, darbuke, tapan and cymbalom.

Jennifer and Hazel Wrigley: These identical 17 year old twins from Orkney are relatively new to the folk scene, but judging by their musical ability you wouldn't believe it. They have won many awards for their musical dexterity on traditional fiddle, guitar and piano with Shetland, Irish, American and Jazz influences.

The M.C.s: Danny Kyle makes a welcome return as 'Fort Holder' extraordinaire. Joining him in this merciless task this year are Aberdeen Folk Entertainers Frank Robb and Danny Couper.
