Four Men And A Dog: One of Ireland's most powerful acoustic bands who have built on the startling success of their debut album, Barking Mad, by adding two of Ireland's very best musicians to an already impressive line-up. Awatiñas: The Festival welcomes its first South American visitors. Awatiñas are Ayamara Indians who specialise in authentic Andean music, playing a multitude of South American instruments, including flutes, pan pipes, drums and guitar. Through an invigorating mix of spritely dances and beautiful music, this band has already won the hearts of many an audience.

Bib and Braces: Award winning street entertainers whose skills at juggling, stilt walking, illusions, salamandery, mime and magic have enthralled young and old alike.

The Cock And Bull Band: A fusion of traditional Anglo-French dance music and their own compositions. Cock and Bull draw on a diverse range of musical roots to provide concert sets of orchestral proportions.

ARTISTES

Luke Daniels and Frank Kilkelly: This year ,at the age of eighteen, Luke's flamboyant accordion playing style won him first prize in the BBC 'Young Tradition Awards' and he has recently replaced Andy Cutting in folk group Scarp. Shetland is certainly familiar with Frank's guitar playing! He first visited with The Companions of the Rosy Hour and returned last year with Spice Trade.

The Flatville Aces : Hail from Southhampton and play acoustic Cajun in an authentic Louisiana style. Fronted by Jock Tyldesley who is recognised as one of Britain's finest cajun fiddlers.

Finbar Furey and Friends: Finbar has had a huge influence on the contemporary folk scene. His love of the Uillean Pipes is without equal and as a master piper and fine exponent of the banjo he has certainly contributed greatly to the success of The Fureys.

Catriona MacDonald and Ian Carr: Shetland's own Catriona is a great exponent of the Shetland fiddle. She won the BBC 'Young Traditional Award' in 1991 and now tutors and performs extensively around Britain. Ian's style of guitar is familiar to Shetland, having performed with Simon Thoumire at the 1991 Festival. lan has recently been playing with the Kathryn Tickell band.

Old Blind Dogs: Aberdeen based band who play a wide variety of energetic jigs and reels. Their rousing songs and anthems are played with feeling and their vocalist, Ian Benzie, is highly regarded as a folk singer.

Outback: A didgeridoo, a guitar, West African percussion and drums. Together these instruments create the unforgettable music of Outback. Employing musicians from three continents and instruments from five, Outback's unique brand of world-fusion remains something refreshingly different.

Pearl and the Prairie Dawgs: Responsible for spearheading the current revival of Western Swing. Pearl's vocals are matched with the classic line up of the genre - that unique twin fiddle sound, Texan guitar, and a rhythm section that swings like crazy!

Brendan Power: A New Zealander who has gained a considerable reputation in his home country, being one of its foremost exponents of the harmonica. Equally at ease with both the Blues Harp and Chromatic Harmonica, Brendan has most recently performed on the lastest albums of both Paul Young and Sting's.

Stockton's Wing: The music of Stockton's Wing has evolved into an exciting blend of traditional and contemporary Irish music and song performed with power and precision by some of the finest musicians in Ireland. Founder members Maurice Lennon and Paul Rouche are accompanied by Mike Hanrahan, Peter Keenan and Dave McNevin.

Stravaig: Currently the top women's acapella group in Scotland. Their blend of songs, from traditional ballads to music hall send-ups, has won acclaim throughout Ireland and the North. The four members of the band, all fine solo singers, combine to create enchanting harmonies.

Värttinä: Energetically singing in close harmony, laughing, mischievously wagging fingers at male members of the audience, this is Värttinä, Finland's première group who win audiences over with the sheer power of their all female front line singing. Putting an end to the idea that Finnish music is all national costume, fiddle and kantele!

The M.C.s: There is indeed a plethora of multi-talented M.C.s this year with many familiar faces returning - Danny Kyle, the follically challenged duo Danny "two-cheeks" Couper and Frank "onecheek" Robb, Jes Kroman, Victor Smith and new face for this year, Gibb Todd.
