Visiting Artistes: Hank Wangford and The Lost Cowboys

Hank Wangford, "The Greatest Living
English Cowboy", is now into his
second decade of touring the length
and breadth of the country with his
"Health and Happiness Show", he's
also been seen presenting Channel
4's "The A - Z of C & W" and "Big,
Big Country". His new and more
acoustic outing with The Lost
Cowboys is a foray down the highways
and byways of Country music through
the ages performing amusing but
always sincere songs.

The Alison Brown Quarter

Banjo and guitar virtuosity on her first solo album brought Alison a Grammy nomination for Best Bluegrass Recording in 1990. Using a number of bases, including New England and California, has allowed Alison to play with many of America's leading folk and bluegrass musicians. Having concluded an extensive tour with Michelle Shocked and last year touring with Danny Thompson, Alison and her acoustic-oriented quartet bring their original material blending traditional, bluegrass, celtic, latin, jazz and world music to this year's festival.

The Flying Bulgar Klezmer Band

Described as "rhythmic, rootsy and totally infectious" this Canadian seven piece band play a joyful, thumping Jewish roots music called Klezmer. A musical form at the crossroads of Europe, the Middle East and America, music of the chazan (cantor), the taragato, the Gypsy fiddle, the New Orleans trumpet and the marching band snare drum. Klezmer has been played in the streets and royal courts and for any occasion where people needed to sing, dance, laugh, cry and generally get loose.

ARTISTES

Afterhours

Combining age old themes from frish folk music withan injection of modern inspiration. Afterhours are breathing new life and passion into Irish music. These four highly talented musicians play with skill and wit, making old songscome alive and new songs appear steeped in tradition. The sheer vitality of this band during two years of ngorous touring and festival appearances have earned them a fine reputation throughout Europe.

The Kimbara Brothers

One of the leading exponents of 'Hot Club' jazz in Britain today, the Kimbara Brothers come to Shetland after recent and highly successful appearances at the Grimsby South Bank Jazz and Blues Festival and others. The dynamic Kimbara's present fast, hot, melodic jazz harkening back to the 1930s, Django Reinhardt, Stephane Grappelli and the Quintet of the Hot Club of Paris and it's folk roots. The line-up includes ex Spice Trade fiddler Chris Haigh and the versatile and adventurous singer Anita Wardell.

Fire in The Glen

Edinburghbased Fire in the Glen formed in February 1993 with a vision of promoting a rich blend of traditional Scottish music. The band's performance at the 1993 Edinburgh Folk Festival was critically acclaimed for their toe tapping, upbeat jigs and reels. They then went on to be crowned "World Ceilidh Band Champions" of 1993 at the Isle of Bute Folk Festival and will appear at the Shetland Folk Festival fresh from a tour of America.

Boogalusa

A six piece band dubbed as Scotland's kings of cajun. They've already got much of Scotland on it's feet with their toe-tapping music. Much of their music is original and, whilst tipping the hat to cajun and zydecotradition, their diverse musical backgrounds give it a more contemporary edge. Recent appearances on Channel 4, BBC1 and Radio Scotland and the release of their debut album have helped bring Boogalusa and cajun and zydeco music to a wider audience.

Séan McGuire

The Festival is delighted to see the return of this distinguished Irish fiddler. Séan is famed for his individual bowing technique and his ability to produce a bewildering array of variations and embellishments on many a great fiddle tune. This year Séan is accompanied by Eileen Hunter.

Green

This Aberdeen duo perform a varied repertoire which includes Scottish, Irish and American traditional music, with jazz, blues and classical music influences from their respective formal musical training.

Palaver

Four Scottish solo singers got together in 1991 for a guest appearance at the Ballyshannon Festival which they took by storm, their success prompted the formation of Palaver. With powerful performances of material ranging from child ballads, gospel and Sweet Honey in the Rock songs, they have since captivated audiences from Derry to Dundee.

Slippery Slopes

Five talented Irish fiddlers - Siobhan Peoples, daughter of the legendary Tommy Peoples, Kevin Glackin is the youngest member of Dublin's foremost fiddling dynasty, Maurice Bradley is a versatile multi-instrumentalist from Derry, Paul O'Shaughnessy, a former member of award winning band 'Altan' and Martin McGinlay who is renowned for his vibrant, energetic style and his extensive repetoire.

Drop The Box

Aberdeen based six piece band consisting of Shetland and Irish musicians. Drop The Box have been described as "A heady brew of rock, Irish and Shetland music traditions", and "a cross between The Waterboys and Stockton's Wing".

The Chipolatas

Fire eating, juggling, acrobatics, unicycling stunts mixed with clog dancing and some spirited musicianship make for English street theatre at its very best.

The M.C's

This year sees the return to Shetland of those stalwart and bronzed Adonis-like comperes Danny Kyle, Danny Couper, Frank Robb and Gibb Todd.
