CRITTON HOLLOW STRING BAND

The West Virginia Eastern Panhandle is the home base of this band. Formed in 1975, the band have toured extensively, mainly throughout the US and Canada. Their music reflects a tradition reaching back to the time of the Appalachians' first settlers, harmonic ballads and melodic folk songs. Appearing with the band will be Laura Lewis, a gifted step dancer and clogger as well as musician.

MAD PUDDING

This Canadian band wowed the audiences at nine UK festivals in 1997, won an overwhelming vote of approval in reviews everywhere they went and have been re-booked at every gig they played. Their music has been described as a "Celtic folk rock funk crossover set to new wave old time tunes" and their new CD "Rattle on the Stovepipe" has already received masses of airplay.

FLOOK!

Comprises three flautists - Brian Finnegan, Michael McGoldrick and Sarah Allen, and guitarist Ed Boyd. Their music, Celtic in influence, is mainly instrumental and incorporates bamboo, wooden and silver flutes, assorted whistles and uillean pipes. Although originally formed only for a one off tour, their instrumental virtuosity has lead to great critical acclaim not to mention a guest spot for Capercaille and their own sell-out show.

THE JAMES HUNTER BAND

Music that transports you back to the 50s and 60s - original, individual classic rhythm and blues, James Hunter has worked with the likes of Van Morrison and John Lee Hooker and Soul Diva Doris Troy features on his current CD "..Believe what I say" Originally from Australia, James has been described as "one of the best two or three British R & B singers there's ever been". According to the critics Hunter "keeps the soul flame alive" with his "yelping and squealing archetypal soul holler".

THE FELSONS

Scottish band The Felsons started out in 1995 with an unashamedly country line-up but since then have pushed the boundaries back to take on a range of influences from early rockabilly, Chicago blues bluegrass and Bob Dylan, to the Beatles, and the Jayhawks. The Felsons were nominated for best British band in the British Country Music awards and their sound has been described as "instant rockin' energy".

DURAS

Four young traditional musicians playing with drive and a unique blend of Irish styles. Three hail from the Emerald Isle - Leonard Barry, Harry Bradley and Donal Clancy, one - Athena Tergis, is from San Francisco. Their music is a classic blend of instruments; pipes, flute, fiddle and guitar, highlighting the strong individual styles that make up this group.

SWAP

Are the pairing of two duos:- from the UK, Ian Carr (who has played with the Kathleen Tickell Trio) and Karen Tweed (of the Poozies); from Sweden, Ola Backstrøm and Carina Normansson. They provide a unique and lively blend of international musical influences - using guitar, piano, accordion, fiddle and voice to produce a fusion of classical contemporary and traditional styles.

PERFORMING ARTISTES

ATTHERACKET

This band demonstrates superbly the joy, spirit and pure fun that is Irish music at its best, playing seriously rhythmic energetic music, which will lift hearts and dare the feet to stop dancing.

MAURICE DICKSON

A native of County Antrim, Maurice put his first band together in 1976 at the age of 16. In 1979 he traded in his engineer's overalls for the insecurity of a life on the road, setting off with a guitar, a sleeping bag and £75, and spent the next four and a half years slogging it round Europe and North Africa, learning his craft. He has been described as "King of the international acoustic music circus" and deservedly so, having played in Germany, Belgium, Holland, Greece and Egypt to name but a few as well as closer to home to packed audiences at the Edinburgh International Folk Festival and the Lemon Tree. Maurice is an accomplished singer and songwriter whose material encompasses a whole range of styles from blues to country, to gentle songs with a Celtic feel and even flamenco.

GRIER-PHILLIPS-FLINNER

Bluegrass trio of outstanding pedigree

Dave Grier - voted guitarist of the year on more than one occasion in the international Bluegrass Music Association Awards

Matt Flinner - winner of national mandolin and banjo championships has toured with 1997 Festival veterans Tim and Mollie O'Brien and has himself previously appeared in Shetland with the band Daily Planet!

Todd Phillips - acoustic bassist and producer, has worked with countless bluegrass, jazz, pop, country and folk artists from Stephane Grappelli to receiving a Grammy Award for Country instrumental of the year in 1983 with the New South

THE PIERRE SCHRYER BAND

Pierre Schryer is a Canadian fiddler/composer of considerable critical acclaim, receiving airplay on national and international media including CBC Radio - Canada, Cork Radio - Ireland and BBC Broadcasting. Musically his style ranges from Irish, Scottish and French Canadian to Canadian Old-Time and American Swing. Touring with Pierre are Brian Picknell, on guitar, his sister Julie Schryer, on piano and multi-instrumentalist Nathan Curry.

KEEPITUP

Keep It Up are four much respected young musicians playing Scottish traditional music on fiddle, concertina, pipes, whistles, guitar and bouzouki. Their line up is Elidh Shaw, Simon Thoumire, Aaron Jones and Malcolm Stitt of Deaf Shepherd, who proved to be a big hit with folk festival audiences last year.

ROSS KENNEDY & ARCHIE McALLISTER

This formidable partnership produces a powerful blend of Scottish music. Their 1996 album "The Gathering Storms" was hailed by Q Magazine as folk album of the year "...the year's best example of tradition treated with passion as well as respect".

COILA

A contemporary Ceilidh/folk band whose music blends modern and traditional Celtic tunes with influences from Scotland, Ireland and North America. Their repertoire includes energetic reels, lilting waltzes, jigs and hornpipes.

THE HYDDLE DOODLES

Band of four young traditional Irish female players, comprising two fiddles, piano accordion and piano. Last seen in Shetland in October as Liz Kane and friends, this band will get the feet tapping with its energetic playing and unique Irish style piano accompaniment.

COLIN REID

Belfast born Colin Reid defies categorisation drawing on country, blues, jazz and classical influences to create his powerful, sensitive and wide ranging sound on the acoustic guitar.

CARMEN HIGGINS

Carmen began playing classical volin at the age of eight and went on to develop an eclectic style, playing punk-rock, jazz, Irish and Scottish folk music. She is best known for her solo Scottish Traditional fiddle music.

Frank Robb

Versatility and originality are the hallmarks of Frank Robb's unique blend of cross-over music and adlib humour. His strength and sensitivity as a musician and songwriter combine with a razor sharp wit and uncanny ability to improvise on guitar, harmonica and vocals.

Robin Laing

One of Scotland's leading folk musicians. An accomplished songwriter, singer and guitarist his music is authentically traditional. If proof of this was required then you need go no further than to witness Laing's "The Angels' Share" performance. This tells the story of our great national drink through song and verse and of course a dash of humour - a treat for all Whisky lovers!

Mike Hancock

One of Britain's foremost Festival performers, combining physical comedy and eccentric character to create a unique explosion of spontaneous and participatory fooling that has been enjoyed by audiences throughout Europe.

Tich Frier

Over 30 years experience, appearing nationally on T.V. and radio, toured extensively overseas and performed at many UK festivals including several appearances in Shetland. This man is one of the most polished and entertaining performers around today.

Steven Robertson

Steven is studying drama at Kirkcaldy and after his impromptu appearance last year, we thought it would be a crime not to include such a talented and up and coming local performer.
