The free opening concert on Thursday (open to all) gives a real taster of what's ahead and there will be a number of late night sessions that are simply too good to be missed.

Flat or wedged heeled shoes **must be worn** at all concert venues and the Festival Club.

Visiting Artistes

- □ SHOOGLENIFTY They're back!! This Edinburgh based band grew a massive Shetland fanbase after their energetic live performances in 1995. This six-man band is credited as being the originators of 'acid-croft', a fiery and infectious blend of Celtic traditional music and dance grooves that band members describe as "hypno-folkadelic ambient trad." They will be appearing on Fri 1st only.
- ☐ CARA DILLON From her early days as part of the folk supergroup Equation, this multi award winning singer from Co. Derry has shown she is a musical tour de force to be reckoned with. 2008 has seen the release of Cara's first live DVD "The Redcastle Sessions" and the highly anticipated release of her 4th album "Hill Of Thieves". With Cara is her husband Sam Lakeman on piano, Ed Boyd on guitars and James O'Grady on Uillean pipes/whistle and fiddle.
- PRIGG A young and highly energetic Finnish-Norwegian fiddle group who seek inspiration not only from Nordic music but also American grassroots styles. The band was founded in the fiddling area of Kaustinen, Finland in 2002 and with their live shows and three albums to date, they've been causing waves on both sides of the Atlantic. Wherever they play, audiences beg for more and Shetland will be no exception! Time to batten down the hatches.
- FELPEYU With Asturian roots, Felpeyu is a wellestablished and yet refreshing act on the Spanish traditional music scene. Their musical approach rests upon a solid rhythm section of bouzouki, bass and bodhran alongside box, fiddle, wooden flute and Asturian bagpipes - played by some of the region's most musically respected musicians.
- ☐ NEW ROPE STRING BAND Made up of four talented musicians playing beautiful and invigorating acoustic music from various traditions around the world. Experienced old-hands Pete Challoner and Tim Dalling (from the Old Rope String Band) have joined forces with experienced old-time musicians Jock Tyldesley and Vera van Heeringen. Expect exuberant theatrics, boundless energy and gorgeous music.
- ☐ VISHTEN brings together four young Acadians who are passionate about the music and dance of their regions of Prince Edward Island and the Magdelen Islands. Having performed over 800 shows world over in the last 9 years, the band have become genuine cultural ambassadors! With their fiery fiddling, step-dancing and four sweet voices, the show is both eclectic and mesmerizing.
- ☐ EMILY SMITH Multi award winning Scottish singer and songwriter, Emily has firmly established herself as one of Scotland's leading lights in folk music. Since becoming BBC Young Traditional Musician of the Year '02, she has gone on to tour world wide and recently gained the accolade of Scots singer of the Year at the Trad Awards, 2008.
- ☐ HAT FITZ The 'wild man' of Australian blues, Hat Fitz hails from Queensland and plays heavily amplified acoustic blues, much of it in the style of blues guitarists from the 20s and 30s. Sometimes in the delicate finger-picking manner of the blues folkies sometimes flat out almost frenzied with growling vocals and driving drums/washboard!

Session Artistes -

☐ ANARKALI - are a new traditional folk band with influences from both Scotland and Ireland, playing both traditional music as well as their own compositions. In January 2009, the band won a prestigious Danny Award at Celtic Connections. The band consists of Sarah Parker on fiddle/vocals, Danny Boyle on flute/whistle/vocals, Martin Hunter on Button Box/whistle, Johnny Canning on fiddle / flute / whistle and Peter Webster on guitar/flute/vocals.

- ☐ ZAR This award winning Danish folk band are bac years after their first appearance. For the last 8 years t have toured and played timeless music from the rich Dat tradition, breathing new life into the old songs and tu ZAR not only finds their inspiration from the international folk-scene but also explore other music-styles such as and pop-music. Last year saw the release of their than album 'Der Brænder en Ild'.
- DÀIMH (da-eve) are the ultimate Scottish, Irish, C Breton, Californian Group! They offer a fresh, up to approach to traditional music with an exciting combina of musicians. Their music is a very high energy, to flowing mixture of tunes and songs from the tradition their respective countries and they fuse together to individual styles to create a unique and compelling sound
- ☐ MADISON VIOLET (aka Madviolet) are a Torobased band, consisting of Lisa MacIsaac (vocals, gu fiddle, mandolin) and Brenley MacEachern (vocals, gu banjo, harmonica) accompanied by multi-instrument Adrian Lawryshyn on double bass. They've been touring globe non-stop for 9 years and wherever they play audier swoon over their storytelling, harmonies, beautiful ly and rootsy bluegrassy sound.
- □ SALTFISHFORTY No strangers to Sheth Saltfishforty are Douglas Montgomery on fiddle/viola Brian Cromarty on guitar/mandola/vocals (both of Scot Folk Band of the Year, 2008, The Chair!). With two albunder their belt and a third in the making, they combine traditional music of Orkney with original composition Their reputation as a fresh and dynamic live act has stem established on the Scottish festival scene, and ta them to festivals all over the world.
- ☐ BROCK MCGUIRE BAND Co-founders of Mor Cloud and two of Ireland's most celebrated tradition musicians, button accordionist Paul Brock and fidd Manus McGuire are teaming up with accompanist D Carey and fiddler and concertina player Niamh Ni Ch (formerly of Riverdance) for this appearance in Shetta This band comprises the very best of Irish musicianship.
- D BOX CLUB This band are bursting with energy enthusiasm and ready to take the music world by storm their blend of traditional, folk, jazz, world and class sounds! Four accordions together could be considered at experiment but is one which works extremely well whe the hands of Gary Innes, John Somerville, Mairearad Grand Angus Lyon and the strong accompanying team Michael Bryan on Guitar, Duncan Lyall on Double Bass Martin O'Neill on drums and percussion
- □ JANI LANG BAND This band was founded Aberdeen in 2006 by Jani Lang, a Hungarian fiddler worded there in 2005. They are a unique collaboration Hungarian, Scottish, Irish and Egyptian musicians driver an enthusiasm for Balkan and Gypsy music. Joining there is multi-instrumentalist Fraser Fifield who aguests on their debut CD 'Devil in a Box'.
