Concessions apply to over 60s, children, students and those in receipt of social security benefit, Income support or Job Seekers Allowance (proof required)

Each SFFS member is able to purchase a maximum of one membership priced ticket per concert.

Transport to and from the concert venues is not provided by SFFS. Ferry crossings are required for the Mid Yell, Haroldswick, Fetlar and Fair Isle concerts. An overnight stay is also required for Fair Isle.

Festival Club concerts are only open to SFFS members. These tickets entitle access to those particular concerts and are not for access to the late night activities, which are open to all members (numbers permitting).

Flat or wedged heeled shoes must be worn at all concert venues and the Festival Club.

Photography

There will be no unauthorised audio or video recordings. Flash photography is strictly prohibited at all concerts and the Festival Club. Official photographers only in designated areas.


